

Bangla Funds For The Needy

The Samhati (solidarity), a non profit Bangladesh Women's Organization, held its first benefit dinner and cultural show on April 5, 1986 at the Bannockburn Club House in Bethesda, MD.

According to Mrs. Noor Jahan Bose, the president of the group, the Samhati was formed about fifteen months ago to help their unfortunate sisters in Bangladesh, who are rejected by society and forced to leave their home and have no one to turn to. Samhati also helps children, some of whom are with these unfortunate women and others who are homeless and parentless. What the group does here is to raise funds and build shelters back home in Bangladesh.

The group has already raised over \$4000. With that it has built a shelter and a medicare unit for these women and children.

More than 150 people attended the function, including the Ambassador

The Early Days: Fundraising Events





April 1,1988

This report provides a brief history of the formation of SAMHITI and its past activities.

On November 10,1984, a few Bangladeshi women at the residence of Mrs. Noorjahan Bose formed a women's organization. The purpose of this organization is to collect funds and use it to help the poor and destitute women and children of Bangladesh. On January 14,1985, the following office bearers were elected for SAMHATI at the residence of Mrs. Rana Farruk:

On April 29, 1985, a plan was made at the residence of Mrs. Nooriahan Bose to raise funds. In the last three years SAMHATI has participated in three garage sales, two annual benefit dinners, two Catholic Charity Bazaars, and various other fund raising activities. In all, about \$12,000.00 has been collected. About \$7000.00 was sent to Rokea Sadan in Dhaka to rent a residence for needy women. Also some money was sent to Jinaidah Mohila Samity in the Jessore District. A detail account of the collection of funds and its disbursement will be provided by the treasurer.

Our Work with Mahila Parishad

- Large portion of work efforts from 1985-2000 supported Mahila Parishad, the largest women's organization in Bangladesh
- Samhati was instrumental in creating the first shelter in Dhaka for survivors of violence against women, Rokeya Shadan
- Started in a rented facility in December 1985
- Samhati provided a total of \$160,000 to finance Rokeya Shadan over the years and to fund the construction of a new facility in 1997







One recipient from each of our three regional program areas


- Anwara Khatun finished secondary school last April and started higher secondary school last June




